Attendees: Amanda, Annie, Bub, Burton, Angela, Sheila, Kristin

- Annie gained owner access to the WHS Facebook page, and added Burton as an admin; Angela will also be given access privileges to participate in and moderate discussions on the page
 - *to-do*: we need to write up “policies” for contributing and participating, to keep the community / forum healthy
- Burton spoke with Brandi (Town Clerk) about adding a dedicated WHS page to the town website; they’ll collaborate to make that happen in the next few weeks
- Angela is working on the next calendar project, currently tracking down old covered bridge pics
- Annie to deposit cash from the Waterville Market’s calendar sales into our account, and to reimburse Bub for last year’s calendar up-front costs
- Burton received two folders of documents and scanned images from a previous WHS member – he has a lot to go through for the next couple months! Kristin also gave more pics from Amos to Burton, for scanning.
- Burton gave a presentation about Historical Society Logos (in Vermont), considerations for designing our own, and led a quick brainstorm on where we wanted it to go; Burton’s partner will begin work on designing candidate logos
- Annie got the Library Board’s permission to move the bookshelf to accommodate the dividing wall between them and the WHS room, but on closer inspection, we decided to just leave it where it is and build the wall around that constraint, though we’ll lose a few inches of hallway width
 - *to-do*: Bub will buy supplies and lead construction of the dividing wall; expected cost ~\$1k, and the timeline is “ASAP”
- Bub found some items for this year’s raffle: ornate candle holders, and dishes from the As You Like It Inn (circa 1890s!)
- We discussed our openness to donations and our interest in curating/displaying them in the WHS room
 - *to-do*: we need to get more specific and document items that are “donations” proper as opposed to (temporarily) “on loan”
- The library will be submitting multiple grants soon, and needs ideas re: history-focused community events related to the country’s 250-year anniversary this July
 - *to-do*: reserve Town Hall for a weekend day in July to host such an event
- The State of Vermont wants us to submit an annual report re: CLG compliance by end-of-month; Burton (+Annie) will give it a shot, something is better than nothing :)
